## Championing a localisation movement in DRR

THURSDAY 1 OCTOBER 2020 | 9:30-12:00 (CET)

### Overview

The aim of this interactive seminar is to amplify the voices of 100,000 people most at-risk of disasters and discuss how we as actors in Sweden can work together to respond to this local data. It will contribute to a roadmap for how to make humanitarian and development work more risk-informed and locally led.

Presentation from GNDR of the nine key conclusions from their *Views from the Frontline* programme. This research has gathered data and perspectives of risk from individuals, local governments and civil society organisations in 575 at-risk communities in 39 countries.
- **What do these findings mean for our humanitarian, development, and adaptation work?**  
Breakout groups will discuss what actions are needed, and by who, for future progress.
- **What can we each contribute to taking these changes forward?**
